Today's learner is Rosie Hartigan Evans, who, at the outset, was certain of her path. With clear ambitions and a strong sense of purpose, she pursued a career she believed was right for her – just as many of our learners do. But it wasn't until she experienced the role firsthand that she realised it didn't align with her expectations or aspirations.

This moment of uncertainty is one we see often. Many students begin with a fixed idea of their future, only to discover that their true passion lies elsewhere. For her, that turning point led to exploring a completely different sector – one she hadn't previously considered – and it was there that everything changed. She found not only enjoyment in her work, but a renewed sense of direction and confidence.

When Rosie started, she undertook some work experience at a local playgroup, but after spending some time there, she discovered that this was not for her. After raising this to our Careers and Work Placement Coordinator, Kath Chapman, who checked in with her daily to see how she was getting on, the pair later spent some time looking for other opportunities for Rosie to grow, something perhaps 'out of the box' in terms of what she was used to, as she desperately wanted a taste of working life.

Soon after, Kath found Pound Farm Shop in Gloucester, who were more than happy to take Rosie on for a placement of two days a week in their shop and café. During her time there, she has been supported by their full-time staff to enable her to learn the 'tricks of the trade': helping and serving customers and tidying the shop floor. Rosie's employer even went as far as to say that "Rosie is very hard-working and eager to learn. A delight to have with us. She's been a pleasure to have and to teach and was great at listening and learning all of her new tasks." When we asked Rosie how she felt about her time at the farm shop, she said, "I have improved a lot in the farm shop, doing several different jobs here, keeping me busy. They have supported and helped me in any situation I may need help in."

This is great news! Rosie has really impressed us with her progress, and not only has she excelled in her work experience, but she's also passed her exams – a massive achievement! Rosie added that the support from PTS has been "great," additionally commenting that "PTS are always there to help whenever I need it, and I would recommend a course to other young people."

Pebbles Nursery

At Prospect Training Services (PTS), we understand that not everyone knows what they want to do for their career – and that's okay. Many of our learners come to us feeling uncertain about their future, and part of our role is to support them in finding a path that feels right for them, at their own pace.

Rather than rushing the process, we offer learners the chance to reflect on their experiences and, if a placement doesn't feel like the right fit, the opportunity to try something different. This case study follows our latest learner, Sky Mayo, whose journey shows how having the space to explore, make choices and try again can build confidence and lead to a more meaningful direction.

Sky made the transition to PTS after finding that college just wasn't the right fit for her, which is the case for a large number of our learners – some people just don't like large classrooms and limited support from their tutors; it doesn't work for every learning style. Once she arrived, our Work Experience and CEIAG team asked her what avenue she'd potentially like to explore career-wise, and her response to this was something to do with care and support services. So with this in mind, our team found a school that provides a variety of life skills and activities for young adults with special needs. However, after a while, Sky discovered that this was not ideal for her, so she asked our team to settle her somewhere else.

After deliberating what to do next, our team suggested Pebbles Nursery, a nursery that has taken on a number of our learners before and whom we have a great relationship with. Thankfully, for Sky, this was a great fit. During her time there, the nursery supported Sky to understand the daily routine of the nursery and answered all of Sky's questions. The nursery also highlighted that "PTS regularly checked in to see if Sky had attended. We have a great relationship with PTS and regular meetings to discuss how the student is doing." When we asked what feedback the employer at Pebbles had about Sky's time there, they replied with, "Sky feels like part of the team and has built great relationships across the team. She's been a great addition and will be missed."

What excellent news! It is clear that Sky really went above and beyond at her placement, with her employer being over the moon with her interpersonal skills and getting on so well with the team. When we asked Sky what she thought about her placement, she said quite simply: "Amazing." And she also mentioned that "PTS helped me find work experience, and I have really progressed since being here. The support has been good, and I'd recommend a course to other young people who are in the same position as me."

Tyler came to our Work Experience and CEIAG team wanting to sink his teeth into labouring, as he prefers physical, hands-on work instead of sitting at a desk. So, without hesitation, we contacted Glevum Building and Maintenance Ltd., whom we have worked with for many years. During Tyler's time there, his employer supervised him while he carried out tasks like carrying materials, cleaning sites and helping tradespeople. He was also given safety gear and basic health and safety guidance so he could work safely.

By the time Tyler finished his placement, his employer commented that "he was a good candidate and the support from PTS has been good," which is music to our ears! We're so overjoyed that Tyler got on so well. And when we asked for what Tyler thought about his progress with PTS, he highlighted, "The support has been good; I learnt about Skills for Life and found a placement. PTS has helped me more than college; I didn't have a job before, and now I do."

This case study highlights the journey of one of our learners who experienced a significant interruption in their education due to personal circumstances, resulting in a two-year gap in formal learning. Situations like this are not uncommon within our education and training centre, where we regularly support individuals returning to learning after periods of absence.

Despite the challenges associated with re-engaging in education – such as rebuilding confidence, adapting to structured learning environments and addressing gaps in knowledge – this learner demonstrated resilience and determination throughout their journey.

Meet Rylee Mayo, who experienced time away from his secondary school studies and was Not in Education, Employment or Education (NEET) due to reasons out of his control. Once he found out about our services at Prospect Training Services (PTS), we offered a platform for tailored support, a personalised learning plan and a focus on both academic and personal development. Rylee arrived eager to sink his teeth into the motor vehicle repair industry, and so with the help of our Careers and Work Placement Coordinator, we quickly found Treeway Motor Repairs – a company that has taken on our learners for valuable work experience opportunities in the past.

Working with Treeway gave Rylee the perfect opportunity to get hands-on in a working environment while also completing his English and maths qualifications at our learning centre, Mill Place. While at his placement, Rylee impressed from the get-go, with his employer saying, “He was very keen to learn, was always on time and had a willingness to learn.” They also mentioned that, “He has come on leaps and bounds; his ability to learn and carry out tasks has really improved.” Rylee’s potential is clear to see; all he needed was a chance to prove himself – a chance that many young people are unable to have; he has really impressed us.

When we asked Rylee how he found his time at Treeway, he said that “my employer showed me how to do almost everything and helped grow my knowledge in mechanics and gave me tools when I left” – how fab! Rylee also kindly added that during his time at PTS, “It’s been amazing; I’ve had no problems at all. I’ve been supported throughout my journey, and I got through my exams due to your support.”

This case study highlights the journey of a learner who has demonstrated exceptional commitment, growth and professionalism during her first steps into the world of work. From the outset, Eve Matthews approached the opportunity with determination and a willingness to learn, quickly making a positive and lasting impression.

When Eve first arrived at PTS, her morale was relatively low. Despite actively searching for employment, she had struggled to secure opportunities. Determined not to let this discourage her, Eve applied to our services in the hope of gaining support and direction. Since then, she has made remarkable progress, taking full advantage of the opportunity to begin her very first work placement at Quedgeley Medical Centre.

With a keen interest in the healthcare sector, Eve embraced the chance to gain hands-on experience, taking on an administrative role within the medical centre. Throughout her placement, she developed valuable workplace skills, built confidence and gained a strong understanding of how a busy surgery operates.

During her time there, Eve was supported with a clear job plan, structured training and regular check-ins. Her employer shared that “it has been a joy seeing Eve grow in confidence and build working relationships with the team. She is very capable and has lots of opportunity and potential to develop in a work environment.” The team also praised her as “conscientious, hardworking and methodical.”

The centre also highlighted the support provided by PTS, stating, “The support from PTS has been very good – engaged, regular contact but with the flexibility to design a placement that suits us.” They added that they were very pleased to have welcomed Eve on placement.

Alex Gardner Wilce joined us shortly after leaving a local college, where he spent a year there. Upon realising that the course didn't suit his needs, he looked for other education and training centres in the area that could give him flexibility – he wanted to be able to dip his fingers in a few pies before fully committing to something, and at PTS, we can offer just that. Alex came to our Careers and Work Placement Coordinator, Kath Chapman, wanting to explore teaching, as he expressed an interest in making a difference in someone's life and inspiring the future generation. It wasn't long before Kath worked her magic and found Cranham C of E Primary School, who were happy to take on Alex as a Teaching Assistant.

During his time there, an employer at the primary school conveyed that, "Alex was hardworking, well-mannered and very personable – he became part of our team quickly. He was a delight to host!" Alex represented PTS in a stupendous manner, and we are so glad that his employers were pleased with his attitude to learning. While there, Alex was mentored by staff members, which gave him the opportunity to learn different teaching styles and made it feel as though every day was a different day – as opposed to the monotony that some jobs offer.

It seemed like Alex really enjoyed his placement and, when he finished, mentioned that he liked to help around the classroom on a day-to-day basis. We also asked Alex how we found the support provided to him by PTS, and he responded with "They gave me advice on my next steps, and we did things like life skills, learnt British Values and had advice with money and jobs." In addition, he highlighted, "PTS was able to help me through any advice needed, and I would recommend them to other young people as they provided support for me throughout."

Following a successful placement as a Teaching Assistant in a primary school, Alex worked closely with our IAG Advisor to explore his longer-term career goals. Through this tailored careers support, he identified a strong interest in the electrical trade and has since secured an apprenticeship with Contingent Services Ltd. as an electrician.

At our learning hub, Mill Place, many young people seek our services due to not receiving the level of support needed to fully access their learning and reach their potential. But, by giving learners the right structured support, clear expectations and consistent guidance from staff, this can help them to rebuild confidence, re-engage with their studies and begin making steady academic and personal progress – this is what we strive for at Prospect Training Services: to show off what young people are capable of!

Before joining us, Jamiee-Lee Sheppard was at college. After not finding her feet there, she wanted to find somewhere that tailored to her needs and somewhere that encourages her to stay on track – at college, she just felt like a ‘cog in a wheel’. Eventually, Jaimee-Lee found us, and she’s been very appreciative of the support that has been provided to her so far.

Jaimee-Lee came in wanting to work with children, as she shows great deals of empathy and strong communication skills, so she was quickly settled into a local preschool in Gloucester, called Saul Montessori – a warm, home-from-home environment where children aged two to five can learn and grow in a mixed-age classroom. While working there, the employer has assisted Jaimee-Lee with an induction and support from management, highlighting that “Jaimee-Lee is doing really well and is becoming part of our team. She is a very motivated individual who is able to work in a busy environment.” We are very grateful for the preschool for offering Jaimee-Lee some work experience, we had great communication and responses when our Careers and Work Placement Coordinator reached out to see how she was getting on.

When we asked how Jaimee-Lee finds the support given to her by PTS, Jamiee-Lee replied with “I’ve been given good support. Some encouragement was needed, but it’s really helped give me options for my future.” Also, during her time with the preschool, Jamie-Lee feels like “It has given me further encouragement to do well on my exams.”

Motor Mechanics

At Prospect Training Services (PTS), we proudly welcome students from a wide range of backgrounds, including those who may have struggled in mainstream education or encountered difficulties outside of school. Our environment is built on understanding, support and high expectations, providing learners with the opportunity to re-engage with education and make meaningful progress.

Before Louie Jewell enrolled in our services, Louie informed our Learner Support Supervisor, Jane Trehearne, that he had done a lot of things that were not good; he spoke openly about some of the things he had done in the past that he was not proud of. Now he feels, through the kindness of the teachers at PTS, he has been able to turn around his life. Louie is currently progressing through his Employability and Work Experience Study Programme – a programme that helps young people, like Louie, aged 16-19 (or 24 with an EHCP), gain the skills necessary to gain employment post-Prospect.

When asked what Louie would like to do for a future career, he was keen to explore a role in mechanics. He has a strong interest in cars and their mechanics and has a knack for problem-solving. So, with this in mind, Kath Chapman (Careers and Work Placement Coordinator) sat down with Louie to discuss some potential options; eventually, they found an employer that was keen to take him on for some work experience.

To begin with, Louie informed his Learner Support Officer (Debbie Millman) that on the first day of his work experience, he didn't think it was right for him, but through the support that Kath Chapman provided him, he managed to get through it and found out that he actually enjoyed the work and that this was what he wanted to do in the future – which is great news! While on the placement, Louie's employer mentioned that "Louie has grown in confidence throughout his time with us. While teaching him the basics of car mechanics, he has shown a willingness to learn and has become far more confident in communication with others."

When asked about the support provided by us at PTS, Louie commented, "The teachers have all helped me. The rules have given me structure and focus. They've been helpful from the first day, and they are always ready to listen." Louie has shown great progress since starting with us, showing that anything's possible with a little bit of help and guidance.

Now, Louie has achieved the first stage of obtaining an apprenticeship as an HGV Mechanic! Well done, Louie! We wish you the best of luck.

At Prospect Training Services, we celebrate progress at every step and work closely with families, carers and professionals to provide the holistic support our young people deserve. Unlike traditional settings that may not always adapt to individual needs, our Illumin8 programme is built around flexible, inclusive teaching strategies and smaller group sizes.

K's journey with us so far reflects something we hold at the heart of our provision – no two learners are ever the same. Each year, we meet young people on very different journeys: some at the beginning of discovering their path, some nearing the next stage and others simply open to opportunity. K has been a wonderful example of a learner finding value in his own unique way. K has really been showing signs of enjoying his time with us and, while his successes have perhaps been more social and personal than academic – which often comes more naturally to him – those achievements are no less significant. His growth in confidence, relationships and wider personal development has been a real success story.

Coming from multiple colleges and just never finding his feet, K came to us as somewhat of a last hope – all he wanted to do was achieve his English and maths qualifications, but he has just not received the right level of support for his needs. Now settled, K is finally happy with his educational pathway. So much so he has stated, "I enjoy all the things here, the snacks, the classroom, the sports hall and the wellbeing room, where there is a dartboard. The support I get here isn't too bad. I like all the staff, of course. Some staff I didn't get on with in my last colleges." K also added that "Staff ask me questions simply. Help me if I am stuck on anything in my work. If I am upset about anything, staff help me. Illumin8 is a really good course."

Great news, K! This is exactly what we like to hear. Sarah Weston (High Needs Manager and SENCo) also raised that "It has been a pleasure to see K engage positively with the programme, enjoy the community around him and develop in ways that will support him well beyond the classroom. His journey is a reminder that success looks different for every learner, and we are proud to have supported him in finding his own strengths and opportunities."

P

At Prospect Training Services (PTS), our High Needs Support (Illumin8) means we take the time to understand each person – their strengths, challenges, goals and the way they experience the world. From day one, our approach is built around them. We tailor every aspect of support to suit their unique needs, ensuring they feel heard, valued and empowered. Whether it's adapting communication styles, creating personalised development plans or providing the right pace and environment for growth.

P's journey reflects the importance of recognising that traditional mainstream expectations do not suit every learner and that success often comes when education is adapted thoughtfully around the individual. For P, adjustments to timings, environment and accessibility needed to be carefully planned, with a personalised approach that truly reflected his needs and previous educational experiences. The response to this approach has been extremely positive. Through consistent buy-in from the staff team, informed theory and professional judgement applied by senior leaders and a deep understanding of P's educational journey before coming to PTS, we have been able to create the conditions for him to re-engage meaningfully with learning.

In addition to doing his English, maths and Progression qualifications, P is currently undertaking gardening – something he takes great enjoyment in. As part of our programme, we offer a wide range of enrichment activities throughout the year, designed to inspire and empower our learners. These experiences go beyond the classroom, encouraging curiosity, creativity and a love of learning.

Originally coming from a previous training provider, P has had outstanding progress while with us and thoroughly enjoys the support given to him, stating that "I enjoy the support I get. I find it helpful. It makes me feel safe and makes me feel I can get my qualifications." Also, "I get supported by everyone at Illumin8. I get supported with my work. Sarah [Weston] and Jo [Mathers] support me with other things. If I had an argument with my girlfriend, I could talk to them. My friends support me here."

This feedback reminds us why we do what we do here at PTS. Sarah Weston (High Needs Manager and SENCo) commented, "P is now accessing education with confidence and purpose and is making outstanding progress in English and maths. It has been wonderful to see him rebuild confidence, reconnect with learning and move forward with renewed direction and potential. We are incredibly proud of the progress he has made and excited for what lies ahead."

R

For safeguarding purposes and anonymity, we have changed the learner's name to the initial R.

On our Illumin8 Study Programme, we know that no two people are the same. Many who join us have experienced support that didn't truly meet their mental or physical needs. That's why we do things differently. We take the time to understand each individual and tailor our approach around them – not the other way around.

R's journey with us so far reflects real commitment and determination – in spite of the challenges he faced previously and still to this day. R struggles with social anxiety, but his willpower to overcome this to the best of his abilities is hugely commendable. R travels a considerable distance to access our programme – two buses each way – a reminder that not every specialist provision sits on a learner's doorstep. Yet R makes that journey not only for the academic opportunities available to him but also for the relationships he has built with tutors, friendships he has developed so far and the valuable social opportunities woven throughout the programme.

Although R has at times lacked belief in himself, we saw his natural ability emerge early on, particularly in his examinations back in January, where he was one of the first to demonstrate genuine academic aptitude. That early success gave him an important boost in confidence, and he has carried that momentum forward, achieving a number of significant milestones along the way. R is currently doing his English and maths qualifications – of which he has already passed his reading exam – alongside a Progression qualification.

When asked to summarise how he felt about the course so far, R accentuated that "I am making progress by attending the Illumin8 programme. My confidence has boosted a lot. I have been talking a lot more since coming here, and I have made one good friend." Moreover, R enjoys the support provided to him, going on to say, "I've got a few teachers to speak to to discuss my feelings, and that is helpful because I have social anxiety and I still don't do well in social situations. I feel relaxed with the staff here. When I first came, I didn't speak to many people, but I've got a strong connection to one teacher, and I talk to everyone here. I can have a laugh with everyone, and I've got nicknames for all the staff."

In response to R's progress, Sarah Weston (High Needs Manager and SENCo) has been key to highlight that "It has been wonderful to watch R grow in confidence, resilience and engagement, recognising his own strengths and beginning to trust in his abilities. His journey shows how the right environment, meaningful relationships and consistent encouragement can help a learner flourish. We are incredibly proud of his progress.

N

For safeguarding purposes and anonymity, we have changed the learner's name to the initial N.

Like with many of our other Study Programmes, our Illumin8 programme offers tailored pathways that build confidence, key skills and clear routes into further education, training or employment. Learners gain real-world experience through work placements and employer engagement, alongside support in English, maths and personal development.

N represents a rare and remarkable case with the programme. He joined us part way through the year, presenting with a clear challenge – a lack of confidence in himself – but what he certainly has not lacked is intellectual ability or application. From the outset, N has demonstrated a strong aptitude for learning and a clear determination to progress. What has stood out about N is his self-belief beginning to emerge through opportunity. He actively asks us to facilitate the learning and provide him with the chance to sit his examinations by July, showing both ambition and readiness to challenge himself. Once given that opportunity to prove himself, N has gone from strength to strength.

Before N was with us at Prospect Training Services (PTS), he was doing Level 2 Professional Cookery, in addition to English Level 1 and Maths Entry Level 3. Now, as he continues to succeed at an impressive rate, we are delighted to say that N has already passed a number of elements of his qualification and is moving at full speed and capacity towards achievement in Level 2 English and maths.

When asked about what N enjoys about the support provided by PTS, he responded with, "It's simple and easy, and all the teachers work well and hard. It helps me and other students a lot; I don't believe there's more they can do. They're great." Furthermore, N added that, "I'm happy with everything that's happening; all the teachers are easy to communicate with; they help a lot and give simple commands. I mainly get help from Jo [Mathers], Sarah [Weston] and Jeremy [Lovelock]."

We're overjoyed that N is getting on so well with us! Sarah Weston (High Needs Manager and SENCo) has said that "His progress has been driven by talent, application and a growing confidence in what he can accomplish. N's journey is a powerful example of what can happen when ability is recognised, barriers are removed and opportunity is matched with determination. We are incredibly proud of what he has achieved in such a short space of time and excited to see him continue this momentum into the next stage of his future.

A

For safeguarding purposes and anonymity, we have changed the learner's name to the initial A.

Our Illumin8 Study Programme at Prospect Training Services (PTS) comprises of five core values. We foster **creativity** by encouraging imagination and innovation and develop **critical thinking** so learners can analyse, question and solve problems effectively. Strong **communication skills** enable them to express ideas clearly and confidently, while **collaboration** teaches them to work productively with others. Underpinning all of this are **collective behaviours**, which promote respect, responsibility and a positive contribution to the wider community.

Not every learner comes to us wanting to continue along a traditional educational pathway, and A is a great example of how success can look different for every young person. For some, achievement is about reaching the expected standard at GCSE level and then finding fulfilment through employment, independence and wider wellbeing – aspirations that are equally valuable and important. A has approached his journey on the programme with a clear sense of purpose, working towards achievement in Level 1 English and Entry Level 3 maths and preparing for the next stage of his life.

Previously, A attended a local college doing Functional Skills English and maths, but he did not complete the course there because it did not work for him. He was later supported to find our services at PTS and, without hesitation, enrolled. During his time with us so far, A has commended that “I mostly enjoy the support offered to me at PTS. It feels better here probably because it’s smaller. I can talk about my needs, and they are mostly able to help me with what I need.” A further commented on the support he gets by saying, “I get extra time to do my work and I get 1-to-1 support if I need it,” which is amazing to hear that he’s settled so greatly with us.

Sarah Weston (High Needs Manager & SENCo) touched on A’s progress by mentioning that, “What has been particularly positive about A’s journey has been seeing him grow in readiness for that next step, with increasing focus on employment, practical skills and personal wellbeing. With a flexible, inclusive approach and real-world learning experiences, Illumin8 prepares learners for their next steps in education, training or employment, while supporting their individual goals every step of the way.

J, who is currently enrolled on our Illumin8 programme, feels like he has reaped the benefits from our services and is progressing at an exceptional rate – after finding that college just wasn't right for him. Before the Illumin8 programme, J was at a local college studying English, maths and Level 1 Life Skills, but felt like he wasn't getting supported enough; he felt like he was being put in a box and that his needs weren't being tailored to.

Now here with us, J is currently working towards his Level 2 qualifications in English and maths and in Progression – an accredited qualification that is designed to support students in their educational journey and help them progress to higher levels of study or work, something we strive to achieve with every learner. Soon after, they contacted Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) Skills Hub to see if they were happy to take on Anya for a placement. While she was there, GCC supported Anya with clear line management and buddied her with another colleague who assisted her with day-to-day tasks. They also mentioned that "the candidate developed many transferrable skills in administration, and her confidence has increased significantly." She went on to say that “before I didn’t really have any routes into getting my dream career, but PTS helped me find a route to help me begin the journey. If I had not been given a work placement, I would not have had the opportunity to get a work experience at such a brilliant place”.

If that wasn’t enough, Esther prospered further by being offered a volunteering job one day-a-week at the pharmacy, on top of paid work on the weekends!

We are really proud of Esther’s progress in her maths and English GCSEs, and the evident impression she made on not just PTS, but her colleagues at Stroud Road Pharmacy. She was simply a delight to have, and we hope we have many people like Esther come to us further down the line.
